## Essential Services Documentation \*SAMPLE\*

Governor Newsom's Office last night released an update on his Executive Order Providing clarification on the "Essential Critical Infrastructure Workers" who are exempt from the Stay Home Order. CALPASC member company employees are explicitly mentioned three times.

In the "OTHER COMMUNITY-BASED GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS AND ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS" section.

\* Construction Workers who support the construction, operation, inspection, and maintenance of construction sites and construction projects (including housing construction)

\* Workers such as plumbers, electricians, exterminators, and other service providers who provide services that are necessary to maintaining the safety, sanitation, and essential operation of construction sites and construction projects (including those that support such projects to ensure the availability of needed facilities, transportation, energy and communications; and support to ensure the effective removal, storage, and disposal of solid waste and hazardous waste.

In the "ESSENTIAL WORKFORCE - PUBLIC WORKS" section.

\*Workers such as plumbers, electricians, exterminators, and other service providers who provide services that are necessary to maintaining the safety, sanitation, and essential operation of residences.

## Worker Safety Guidelines \*SAMPLE\*

- Best Practices for Construction to prevent exposure to COVID-19:
- Actively encourage sick employees to stay home.
- Monitor employees on the jobsite, and remove any ill employees from the worksite. Symptoms of COVID-19 are fever, cough, and shortness of breath.
- Keep a six foot distance from other workers.
- Keep the distance even if utilizing a CPH(Construction Personnel Hoist) or other conveyance.
- Do not interchange tools, equipment, cups, or other personal items with other workers.
- Wash hands frequently with soap and water rubbing your hands together for at least 20 seconds, or use hand sanitizer.
- Do not touch your eyes, nose, mouth or any other part of your face with your hands.
- Use PPE including gloves and safety glasses where appropriate.
- Use appropriate cough and sneezing etiquette. Cover mouth and nose with flexed elbow or tissue, not your hand. Dispose tissue immediately.
- Keep workplace clean.
- Clean commonly touched areas frequently.
